ESSER Background

- Federal grant: The purpose of ESSER in general is to award subgrants to local educational agencies (LEAs) to address the impact that COVID-19 has had, and continues to have, on elementary and secondary schools.
- ESSER I (\$100,354) (92,010 salaries) (8,344- supplies)
 - TEA reclaimed this amount as a reduction in Foundation School Funds to support ADA Hold-harmless
 - ESSER II (\$415,375)
 - TEA will reclaim some of this to support 2019-2020 hold harmless
 - ESSER III (\$932,873)
 - TEA cannot reclaim these funds
 - 20% must be used on learning activities outside of the regular school day

ESSER Background

- Any allowable use of funds to be charged to the ESSER grant must be reasonable and necessary, the <u>LEA must justify the use of funds to the intent of the ESSER statute</u> (which is to prevent, prepare for, or respond to the COVID-19 pandemic, including its impact on the social, emotional, mental health, and academic needs of students), and the LEA must align it to an allowable activity in the statute. USDE has clarified that ESSER I, ESSER II, and ESSER III grants may be expended for any allowable activity codified under statute in ESSER I, II, or III; making the allowable activities interchangeable among the activities that are listed in Section 18003(d) of the CARES Act, Section 313(d) of the CRRSA Act, and Section 2001(e) of the ARP Act.
