Routines: A Maker or Breaker There is much written on the importance of routine for both adults and children. Adults must have the self-discipline to find routines that are productive and continue the routine in a manner that leads to daily success. Children, however, need adults to help them form productive routines and help them stay disciplined in following the routine. What do your routines at home look like? Do you have a set time for play, homework, family meal, bathing & teeth brushing, bedtime? Routines take the guesswork out and provide security for children. Consider a set time and place for doing homework. Sit down with your children and either help them or read a book or magazine for yourself. Eat as a family as much as possible. Have a regular and consistent bedtime. Routines will help your child do better in school and do better in life!

Montessori Message Our 3's are adjusting well to our routines and procedures. They are doing a lot of practical life work. Our 4's are working on writing their names in cursive and are very engaged in the math area of the room. Our 5's are working on the letter G, learning about compound words, and also doing a great deal of math. In geography and in science, we are continuing to study Texas. We are very much enjoying having Mrs. McGowen teaching music classes here at the Montessori each day! They are learning about steady beat, movement, and echo singing! The 5-year-olds are beginning to experiment with instruments. Be sure to ask your students what work they have done this week.

1st-**5**th **Grade** I In music, the First-Third graders are working on moving to the steady beat and identifying rhythm patterns. The 4th and 5th graders are reviewing note names and rhythms so they can start working in groups on percussion, xylophones and recorders. First Grade will be working on Sequence of Events and Verbs in ELAR. In Social Studies, students are learning about Rules. In Math, they will be working on strategies for adding. In Science, they will be gin reading different versions of The Three Little Pigs. They will compare and contrast, study plots, and participate in literacy groups. In math students are working on comparing and ordering numbers up to 1,200. In 3rd grade Math, students are wrapping up the unit, foundations of numbers, learning how to round, compare numbers, and place value. They will continue to spiral these concepts back into their review throughout the year. They are having fun and learning a lot in centers. Great job on doing Think Through Math! The goal is to complete at least 30 lessons and some kids already have 5 knocked out! Third grade Science is finishing PBL posters and learning about plant life cycles. In Social Studies, students are reviewing map concepts and learning about historical figures. Fifth graders are continuing to read about Brian's adventures in Hatchet. They are learning how an author uses figurative language to help the reader better understand the text. Please check your student's binders. They need the support from the parents and teachers to keep their binders organized. In Science, 5th Grade is building their wind turbines and conducting their PBL experiment.
