Students are also exploring the Texas Wildlife Association's bird trunk. They are continuing to study North America. Saturday is the first day of autumn, so they are discussing seasons in class. Everyone is continuing to work at their own pace in math and language. The Kindergarteners are learning about the letter Pp. In Music, the children are continuing to work on steady beat through different body movements. Next week they will get to try out some instruments.

Sept 26: Ava Burrell – 5th

1 st-5th Grade Like In music, 1 st - 3 rd grade students are learning many rhythms and the difference between rhythm and steady beat. 4th grade is beginning their recorders, and they are making good progress. 5th grade is divided into percussion groups learning the xylophone, recorder, and drumming. This week in 1 st grade, students will be taking six weeks tests in Reading and Math. They are learning about story structures and antonyms. In Math and Social Studies, they are learning about time. Science classes are learning about the scientific method. In 2 rd grade reading, students will be learning about and practicing dictionary skills. In 3 rd grade Science, students are completing their PBL posters. In Social Studies, student are learning about freedom and the Declaration of Independence. In 4th grade math, students are finishing adding and subtracting decimals and whole numbers this week as they prepare for six weeks tests next week. As students finish up PBLs in 4th grade, students are working to finish their posters. They will analyze data and build graphs in Math. 5th grade has finished a busy first six weeks. They had six weeks tests this week and have done a great job showing what they have learned. PBLs are being edited and prepared for print. Your student will be reading a new book next six weeks called *Island of the Blue Dolphins*. They will be able to compare and contrast their new book with *Hatchet*.
