Montessori We are doing our beginning of the year testing this week and next. We are starting with the kindergarteners and then will continue with the preschoolers. The testing is to give us a benchmark to see how much they improve throughout the year. Mrs. Wilson brought in salamanders this week, and Mrs. Elmore's class is continuing to watch the super worms for signs of metamorphosis. The kindergarteners are studying the letter "A" during Saxon time and will receive their first reading book this week. Everyone is studying fall.

1st-5th Grade III This week, first grade will be learning what an engineer does in Science classes. In Math, they will be learning about tens and ones. Reading classes will be learning about characters and writing in complete sentences. Social Studies classes will be learning what history is. Second grade math students are continuing to learn basic addition facts. They began studying fractions this week. In reading, students are learning about apples and Johnny Appleseed. Friday, they will be enjoying homemade applesauce. Third graders are reviewing how scientists investigate questions in Science and learning about different cultures in Texas. In math, they are continuing subtraction with regrouping, reviewing rounding by tens and hundreds, and Mrs. Rackley will be implementing a number of the day warmup activity. They are also working in independent centers and on Think Through Math. In 4th grade Science, students are finishing up their Photosynthesis PBL posters and are practicing their presentations. In Social Studies, students are studying the Historic American Indians and Rumination and Contemplation: Nathaniel Bacon's Rebellion. Fifth grade classes are now reading The Island of the Blue Dolphins. They will be writing an alliteration poem about Hatchet. Spelling this week will require parents initials, so please ask you student about their spelling assignment. In math, students are moving on to place value in decimals. They will be estimating/rounding, adding, subtracting, comparing and ordering decimals. In Science/SS students are starting their work plans.
