Montessori

The Montessori students continue to dive into North America: its culture, animals, foods, flags, and more! They are learning the parts of a plant in Botany as well as the parts of a fish in Zoology through puzzles and 3 part cards. This week is fire prevention week and students are learning about firefighters and their contributions in the community. The Kindergarten students are learning letter Mm and started their first reading lists to practice at home. Some classes continue studying the life cycle of butterflies. Mrs. Wilson's class will finish painting their paper Monarch butterflies while several real Monarch butterflies visited the class on Tuesday for scientific observation. They will also continue experimenting with the sink and float lesson which is a class favorite!

1st-5th Grade III In music, 1st-3rd are busy singing on solfeggi syllables (sol, mi and la) and adding many instrument parts to our music. 4th graders are earning their recorder belts, and 5th graders are busy with percussion stations. This week in first grade, students will be learning about natural resources and manmade products in Science. In Math, they will be working on subtraction strategies. Social Studies classes are learning about fire prevention. In Reading, students will be working on sequencing and realistic fiction. This week in 3rd grade ELAR, students are learning about poetry and imagery. Be sure to study for this week's spelling test. Don't forget, reading logs are due each Friday. In science, students are finishing work plans and presenting PBLs. In 4th grade math, students are multiplying 2-digit by 2-digit numbers using partial products and the standard algorithm. In ELAR, students are learning about the writing process and narrative strategies as they write and read suspense stories. Fifth grade math students are multiplying decimal numbers using models, partial products, and the standard algorithm.
