Montessori Memo In music, the kids will be singing fall songs about pumpkins and scarecrows while they continue to work on steady beat. They are studying the letter "Ii" during Saxon time. Mrs. Elmore's father, Herb Nordmeyer, came last Wednesday to talk about Haiti. He showed pictures and answered lots and lots of questions. It was perfect timing since we are studying North America for the month of October. Mrs. Martin now has 4 salamanders. The students are enjoying all of the animals in the various classrooms.

1 st - 5th Grade In  $1^{st}$  In  $1^{st}$  - 5th grade music, students will be working on the difference between Major and Minor sounds and will be singing many fun fall songs. In First Grade, Math classes will be learning about subtraction strategies. In Reading, students will be learning about the sequence of events and character analysis. Science classes will be learning about matter. Social Studies classes will be learning about past, present and future. Second grade math students are working on learning different strategies to work 2-Digit Addition problems. In science, students will be working on what matter is and the different forms of matter. Reading will include comparing different stories by the author Tommie dePaola. This week, third grade students will continue learning about the founding fathers and practicing strategic highlighting. This goes along with any class, so be sure to ask your child to review the questions or topic they are reading and learning about prior to reading the text. Students in the fourth grade are continuing to write suspense stories and study the genre of short stories in Ms. Boren's classes. Students are learning many narrative writing strategies, how to write with description, and how to edit and revise their own stories. Congratulations to all the 4th Graders for a job well done on their Photosynthesis PBL Project! In Social Studies, they will be learning about the New World! This week in math students finished their multiplication unit and took a test. Now they will work with division using base ten blocks and the standard algorithm with no remainders. Fifth grade math students are finishing up multiplication and division of decimal numbers and will have a test review to study this weekend. In reading, 5th graders are learning about themes. They have identified themes in *Hatchet* and are working on identifying themes in Island of the Blue Dolphins. Students have also been working on a map project for the Island of the Blue Dolphins. Please encourage your student to share what they read in class with you. This will boost their summary
