Montessori

The Montessori students are studying North America and the letter N this week. The kindergarteners got their first readers last week, and they get their first colorful books this week. Most of the classes will be studying monarchs this week, in anticipation of the monarch migration. In music, Montessori students had fun playing instruments last week and are now moving on to trains. They will be singing train songs and moving to the beat of trains.

1st-5th Grade III In music, 1st-3rd are busy singing on solfeggi syllables (sol, mi and la) and adding many instrument parts to our music. 4th graders are earning their recorder belts, and 5th graders are busy with percussion stations. This week in first grade, students will be working on what materials are made of in Science. In Math, they will be working on strategies for adding. Social Studies classes will be learning about Christopher Columbus and maps. In Reading, students will be working on sequencing and sentence parts. Second grade will be modeling and naming fractional parts, making landforms out of Play-Doh, and will continue to focus on dictionary skills. This week in 3rd Grade Math, students are wrapping up the Addition and Subtraction unit by focusing on Keywords and how they are used in Word Problems. They will fine-tune Money counting skills as well as touch on Rounding again. In ELAR, students are learning about poetry and imagery. Be sure to study for the spelling test which is each Friday. Don't forget, reading logs are due each Friday. Students are learning about scientists, what they do and the tools that they use to investigate while reviewing cultures and how they influence communities. In 4th grade, students are preparing to present their PBL posters to judges. They are also reviewing Texas geography, government, and the first people of Texas. In math, students are multiplying 2-digit by 2-digit numbers. Fifth grade math students are finishing up Unit 4 over decimals and will have a TEST on FRIDAY. In Science they are finishing up circuits and insulators. In Reading, students continue reading Island of the Blue Dolphins. They will be creating a map of the island and creating a vocabulary cube.
