1 st-5th Grade III In music, all grades are working on Thanksgiving songs. They are learning many folk songs, Native American songs and fun Turkey songs. First grade has also started working on their Christmas musical and are very excited to learn the music! This week in 1st grade, students will be working on greater than and less than in math. Science classes will be learning about magnets. Reading will be learning final stable syllables and sequence of events. Social studies will be learning about maps. In second grade math, students are finishing up the unit on 2digit subtraction and will then begin learning about two-dimensional and three-dimensional figures. In social studies, students are reviewing American Symbols and the roles of the president, governor, and mayor. Reading students continue to compare different versions of Stone Soup in regards to setting, plot, and characters. In 3rd grade math, students are finishing data analysis and will have a test on Friday. In Reading, students beginning the live wax museum project and researching American heroes using biographies and autobiographies. Students are learning about different forms of energy in Science. In 4th grade math, students are starting their fraction unit. They are learning about equivalent fractions and fractions in simplest form. They will also learn about comparing, adding, subtracting fractions and about mixed numbers and improper fractions. In reading, the 4th grade is reading The Whipping Boy by Sid Fleischman. They are studying vocabulary from the text and comparing and contrasting characters within the text. They are writing personal narratives about a favorite holiday memory. In 5th grade reading, students continue to read Touching Spirit Bear and are discussing the difference between Traditional Justice and Circle Justice. Ask the students to summarize the book for you so it enhances their comprehension. In Science students are getting an introduction to Earth Science. In Social Studies, students are looking west with the expansion of the colonies and the study of the War of 1812.
