Montessori Memo We have started South America. Over the course of the month, we will be tasting some foods from South America. We also are working with the puzzle maps, card activities, and various items from around the continent. We sent out report cards on Tuesday; please make sure to sign and return them to school in the envelope provided. Stay tuned for news about our Thanksgiving Meal on November 15.

1 st-5th Grade III In music, 1st grade is starting to work on their Christmas play called TOYS! Parents will be receiving information about the play soon. Second and third graders are using xylophones to work on high and low sounds. The 4th and 5th graders are still working on instruments and getting ready for the Veteran's Day program. This week in 1st grade, students will be learning about text and graphic features in informational texts. They are learning about customs and holidays in social studies. In math, they will be learning about place value with tens and ones. Second grade math students continue learning how to regroup 2-digit subtraction problems. In reading, students will read Stone Soup, focus on the word share, and use inferencing skills to gain a deeper understanding of the story. In Social Studies, students will study voting, freedom, and government roles. In 3rd grade math, students are learning about data analysis. In Reading, students are studying biographies and autobiographies. Don't forget reading logs and spelling tests are due Friday. Students are learning about physical properties of matter and reviewing constitutional government. The Safety City Trip was today! In 4th grade math, students are starting their fraction unit. They are learning about equivalent fractions and fractions in simplest form. They will also learn about comparing, adding, subtracting fractions and about mixed numbers and improper fractions. In reading, the 4th grade has begun reading *The Whipping Boy* by Sid Fleischman. They are studying vocabulary from the text and comparing and contrasting characters within the text. They will start writing personal narratives this week about a favorite holiday memory. In 5th grade reading, students are reading a new novel entitled Touching Spirit Bear. They will be learning about Tlinglet Native American culture. The students continue to work on animal research.
