Montessori Memo We have started growing seeds in our classrooms for the Tower Garden in the entry way! We are growing lettuce, tomatoes, cucumbers, and basil. We are studying holidays around the world; this week we focused on Hanukkah and Christmas. We are using this theme in all areas of our curriculum. For example, the children are learning to wrap presents in the practical life area, are working on Christmas carols in music, and are doing holiday-themed language work, among other things.

1st-**5**th **Grade** We First Grade will be working on skip counting in Math and force and motion in Science. Reading classes will be working on compound words, contractions, and digraphs. In Social Studies they will be reviewing maps and landforms. Second Grade math students are learning all about three-dimensional solids. Students are learning how to name, sort, and classify these shapes based on their attributes. In Science, students are studying Earth and its natural resources. In reading, students are studying the three Rs of poetry: rhythm, rhyme, and repetition. In Third Grade reading students are working on summaries and character traits. In math, students are digging into fractions. They will see examples and non-examples of fractions, match fractions to a model, and use fractions on a number line. In Science, students will finish up with different types of energy and begin studying forces of motion. In Social Studies, students are finishing up with the study of Earth's resources, interacting with the environment, and reviewing map skills. Fifth Grade math finished up Unit 10 and tested this week. Be sure to study the reviews for next week's posttests. In reading, your student will continue reading *Touching Spirit Bear*. They will be working on identifying theme, comparing, and contrasting circle justice and traditional justice. In Science, students are studying alternative energy, modeling landforms, weathering, and deposition.
