Montessori Memo This week we are working on the letter E, Africa, dinosaurs, and telling time. The kindergarteners are doing their TPRI testing (for reading readiness/reading skills). In Music at the Montessori the students are working on loud and soft and the music words Forte and Piano that go with these dynamics.

1st-5th Grade In music, 1st-4th graders have been reviewing rhythms and solfege syllables and doing many fun activities and songs to help learn. 5th graders are exploring all the different band instruments and are getting to try them all out to see which ones they like the best for next year! First grade will be working on money this week during math classes. Reading classes will be working on comparing and contrasting. Social studies will be learning about how to be a responsible citizen and science will be learning about the different types of soil. Second grade math students are learning to write and solve 3-digt math word problems using addition and subtraction. In science and social studies, they are learning ten more states and all about producers and consumers. Reading is all about Jan Brett this week. They will discuss similarities and differences in the plot and setting of several of her works. In 3rd grade ELAR students are writing expository paragraphs. Be sure to practice spelling words and turn in reading logs. In Science students continue to investigate force and motion. In Math students continue with personal finance literacy. In fourth grade ELAR, students are working on close reading strategies for nonfiction writing while they read an article about service dogs. Students will finish their BIO poems as they complete the poem study. In Math, students are working in the geometry unit, focusing on Area and Perimeter of rectangles and squares. They will also start looking at customary unit conversions. In Science they will be studying landforms, weather, and the water cycle. In Social Studies they are studying the Alamo. The students will be making a replica of the Alamo towards the end of the six weeks. In fifth grade reading, students will continue reading "Out of the Dust". They will be learning about the Dust Bowl and the Great Depression. Students will be creating a double timeline to summarize events in the story, and historical information from the 1930's. In Science they will be learning about the water cycle and weather patterns. They are working with a Discovery Trunk from The Texas Wildlife Service that is helping us with this. Social Studies we are working on the Civil War and the Reconstruction Period. In math, we will finish up finding equivalent fractions to add/subtract fractions.
