**Montessori Memo This week the kindergarteners are studying the letter V. They celebrated Chinese New Year on Tuesday and are beginning to study Europe, birds, plant stems, and Black History month. In music, they are working on high and low sounds and were able to play the Boomwhackers to try out different sounds. They are looking forward to a great turnout at the Montessori Parent Night tonight. Students have been working hard and are excited to show you what they have been learning. Come join us! Cookies will be served!!

1st-5th Grade In music, all grades have been working on Freedom songs from the Underground Railroad and discussing how music played a part in the escape from slavery. The 5th graders have tried four different instruments to see which is their favorite for band next year. We still have more to try to see which is the best fit. First grade will be learning about graphs and 2-dimensional figures in Math. Science classes will be learning about pollution. In Reading, students will be learning about informational tests, summarizing, and author's purpose. In Social Studies, they are learning about presidents and patriots. Second grade math students are beginning to work on telling time using analog and digital clocks. In Science, students will learn about the solar system. They are reading Grandpa's Corner Store and making personal and community connections. In third grade, students are learning about procedural writing. No spelling test this week. In math, students are moving on to multiplying 2-digit numbers and division. Students have homework every night that is due on Fridays. In Science and Social Studies students continue learning about the branches of the government while reviewing map skills and graphing skills. Please remember that graded papers are sent home each night, and folders need to be signed each night. In 4th grade reading classes, students are learning close reading strategies while reading an article titled "Spider Skills." They are using the writing process to write a persuasive essay or letter. In Science, students are finishing the water cycle. In Social Studies, students will explain events that led to the annexation of Texas to the Unites States. Reminder: Alamo Projects are due February 12th through the 15th! Students are encouraged to use natural materials and keep the project the size of a shoe box, tissue box, or ½ the size of a poster board. In 5th grade Math, we are reviewing fractions with word problems and will soon be moving on to classifying triangles and quadrilaterals. Students will continue to read "Out of the Dust" and learn the causes and effects of the Depression and Dust Bowl. Fifth graders will also continue to work on timelines. In Science, they will be working on finishing STAAR Vocabulary Cards. These will be kept in their binders to study not only at school but also at home. In Social Studies, students will be working on the Great Depression and the Dust Bowl.
