*Montessori Memo This week we are studying the letter X. We learned about President's Day on Monday Upcoming Events	

This week, we are studying the letter X. We learned about President's and have been learning a bit about black history. We are still studying Europe, and we will have our capstone European Culture Day next week. In music, students are still working on high and low sounds. They will be putting these sounds onto xylophones soon!

1st-5th Grade In music, 1st and 2nd grade are working to differentiate the beat and the rhythm. They are using a lot of instruments to do that. $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ graders are still learning many new rhythms, notes, and fun games and activities to go along with all the new things they are learning! In first grade reading, students will be working on compound words, cause and effect, and prepositional phrases. In Social Studies, they are working on learning rights and responsibilities. In math, they will be learning about fractions. Sciences classes are working on seasons. In 2^{nd} grade math, students are beginning to learn to measure length. They will measure with nonstandard units like paper clips or color tiles. They will also measure length with standard units of measure using inches, feet, and yards. Science students are studying goods and services. In reading, students continue to read about Helen Keller. In 3rd grade ELAR, students are beginning opinion writing. There will be NO spelling test this week. In math students are studying 2-and 3- dimensional shapes. In Science, students are learning about space and the Solar System. Be on the lookout for information regarding the solar system project. In 4th grade, students are starting a new book study with The BFG. They began a new writing project, an expository essay, to help prepare for the STAAR. They continue to use close reading strategies and proofreading practice. In math, students are learning how to use a protractor to measure an angle and draw an angle. AWESOME ALAMO PROJECTS!! Thank you for your hard work. We are learning about the impact of the Mexican-American War on Texas. In 5th grade reading, students are working on inferencing and comparing and contrasting while researching. In math students are studying volume, area, and perimeter. In Science, students are studying ecosystems and will be researching/creating new animals for certain ecosystems/biomes.
