Roscoe Collegiate Montessori Early Childhood Center works hard to provide a supportive and successful environment for all students. The compact is distributed to all parents to ensure a positive educational experience for learners. There are certain expectations that must be met by each group to keep this relationship strong.

School Staff will:

- Maintain open communication with parents regarding student academic and social progress via emails, phone calls, and parent conferences.
- Provide a safe, supportive, and positive environment for learning.
- Motivate all students to reach their full potential.
- Assist parents by providing at-home activities, interventions, and tools to help their students with their education.
- Provide parents with opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child’s class and to observe classroom activities.
- Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction through research-based Montessori curriculum, the Texas Pre-K Guidelines, and the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS).

Parents will:

- Be responsible for regular, punctual attendance.

School starts at 7:50 and ends at 3:30 Monday-Thursday and at 3:15 on Friday. Students are tardy after 7:55.

- Be responsible for updating the school of telephone, address (both mailing and physical), and email changes.
- Assist and support their child’s learning by providing proper nutrition.
- Allow for 10-12 hours of sleep each night.
- Actively monitor their child’s screen time and technology use.
- Encourage their child to use skills learned at school.
- Be responsible for replacing all technology, classroom, and Montessori Materials broken or damaged through the child’s misuse.
- Provide time for their child to read, be read to, and do homework for 20-30 minutes each night. Assistance will be needed.

Homework may include flashcards, writing practice, and assignments from the teacher.

- Attend and participate in all parent-teacher conferences, meetings, and communicate regularly with the teacher.
- Participate and/or volunteer for school and classroom activities.
- Treat school staff with courtesy and respect.
- Check and sign their child’s folder daily.
- Follow and comply with all pick up and drop off procedures.

Students will:

- Come to school prepared with appropriate materials.
- Read, look at books, and do homework for 20-30 minutes each night and ask for help when needed.
- Help keep the school safe.
- Be respectful of all technology, classroom, and Montessori Materials; treat them with care.
- Respect and cooperate with other students and adults.
- Follow the District and Campus Codes of Conduct for rules and safety.

Family Engagement Plan

At Roscoe Collegiate ISD, we value our families, and we understand the importance of involving our families in the education of our students. This plan outlines strategies to support family-to-family engagement, to provide a network of community resources, to involve families in the decision-making process, to equip families with tools to enhance and extend learning, to develop staff to support families in meeting their children's learning benchmarks, and to evaluate and improve on the family engagement strategies used each year.

Roscoe Collegiate Montessori Early Childhood Center (RCMECC) is committed to engaging parents in meaningful educational experiences with their children. RCMECC will solicit informal input from parents throughout the school year. Parents can formally provide input by way of parent survey and Title I year-end meetings each year during the spring.

Roscoe Collegiate Montessori Early Childhood Center qualifies as a school-wide Title I campus, which means we use Title I funds to provide services for all students in grades PK-6. The Family Engagement Plan and the Parent/Teacher/Student Compacts are given to each child at the start of school with the School Handbook and Code of Conduct.

In conjunction with Meet the Teacher in August, we will have the annual meeting for parents. At this meeting information about Title I guidelines will be reviewed as well as the Parent/Teacher/Student Compact. Parents will be encouraged to become involved in the revising and updating of the policy as necessary and parent volunteers will be recruited for the various district committee appointments. Notice of this meeting is provided through written invitations to parents and through public notices.

Family-to-family support

- RCMECC has created a Facebook page to encourage positive communication from one parent to another.
- RCMECC will discuss the family engagement plan and the importance of family-to-family support to parents at an annual meeting.
- Parents will be encouraged to make connections with each other through classroom events.
- RCMECC will host campus events focused on parental involvement, such as Literacy Night.
- RCMECC will offer ongoing parent support grounded in Capturing Kids' Hearts, Grace and Courtesy, and Peace Education.

- RCMECC will provide a handout that will include a list of local resources with url addresses and phone numbers. These will be distributed in a Welcome Packet. The list shall include, but not be limited to

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- RCMECC will collect surveys each spring (for currently enrolled families) to determine family interests and needs. A survey will also be given to new families as they register in the spring and summer. The surveys will be evaluated in order to plan family activities, plan parent development classes, and revise the community resource list.
- RCMECC will recruit/identify people who are willing to serve as translators as the need arises. Translators will agree to have their contact information listed on the local resources handout.

Family participation in decision-making

- RCMECC will work through a site-based decision-making committee that will include at least one parent. That parent will also be invited to the Roscoe Collegiate ISD district site-based meetings.
- RCMECC will solicit input from all parents concerning the parent-teacher-student compacts, and family engagement plan.
- RCMECC will collect surveys each spring designed to allow parents an opportunity to evaluate the ECC and provide suggestions for improvement.
- RCMECC parents will be invited to the year-end Title I meeting designed to solicit parent input.
- RCMECC will include parents from the ECC in the annual Title I meeting held at the beginning of school.
- RCMECC will sustain an open communication that makes teachers and administrative staff available to parents on a daily basis.

RCMECC will equip families with tools to enhance and extend learning...

- RCMECC will continue to educate all students using the Montessori Method of instruction, enhancing and extending socialization, and facilitating parent involvement for all RCMECC parents.
- RCMECC will provide parent training and support throughout the year in the Montessori Philosophy and Method, curriculum, and assessment process to parents.
- RCMECC will host a family night that will engage parents in the Montessori Philosophy and Method of Instruction.
- RCMECC will implement a functional and effective Parent Resource Center to serve our Early Childhood Campus families.
- RCMECC will provide the following:
 - Special Montessori informational meeting at the beginning of the year
 - Separate Montessori Early Childhood Campus Meet the Teacher Night
 - Parent-Teacher conferences with all parents

- RCMECC will publish a newsletter to keep parents informed of important information including program activities, suggestions for parents to become involved in their child's education, activities that can be done at home for little or no cost that correspond to activities done in the classroom, and upcoming events. This will be made available in digital format as well.
- RCMECC will send home a monthly calendar of events occurring at the ECC.
- RCMECC will provide information to parents in a format and language they understand.
- RCMECC will provide parents frequent reports on student progress. Report cards are sent home every six weeks.

RCMECC will provide professional development opportunities for educators on culturally responsive, evidence-based strategies that support education of the child.

- RCMECC will promote and develop family engagement as a core strategy to improve teaching and learning among all educators and staff.
- RCMECC will provide essential professional development for educators in understanding communication and engagement with families.
- RCMECC will train children to greet and say good-bye to teachers, parents, visitors, and their classmates as a means to show respect for all program participants.
- RCMECC will use developmentally appropriate activities to help children understand differences in families, cultures, and traditions.
- RCMECC will make space available for staff to meet with families privately.

Evaluate family engagement efforts and use the evaluations for continuous improvement

- RCMECC will include family engagement efforts on the spring survey designed to identify family interests and needs.
- RCMECC will evaluate parent survey responses during the campus comprehensive needs assessment during the spring and summer.
- Changes to family engagement efforts and the family engagement plan will be highly dependent on parent input.
- In May of each year the SBDM Committee will review and evaluate all aspects of the parent involvement program and the Family Engagement Plan. This meeting will be advertised in the newspaper inviting all parents to attend. Parent surveys including questions about the effectiveness of the program will be distributed in March each year and the results will be tabulated. Changes will be made to the Parental Involvement Policy based on the results of this annual review.
